The artist with a tiny canvas

LTHOUGH Hasan Kale, the famous Turkish (土耳其的) micropainter, has never had any formal arts training, he can still paint on any tiny surface, including throwaway items like the head of a matchstick and pumpkin seeds.

Kale's micro-pictures are quite exquisite, and he paints in every detail. People usually have to use a magnifying glass to see these small elements. Kale said it usually takes him six months to finish one art piece.

Kale's most famous paintings are a scene from the movie Pulp Fiction reproduced on a popcorn kernel, and a portrait of Mustafa Kemal Ataturk, the founder of modern Turkey, on a grain of rice.

Kale began researching about micro-painting back in the 1980s, and nowadays he can paint on about 300 kinds of tiny things. Items that most people dismiss, such as tiny rocks, sand from the beach or even a fish bone, can become his canvas.
